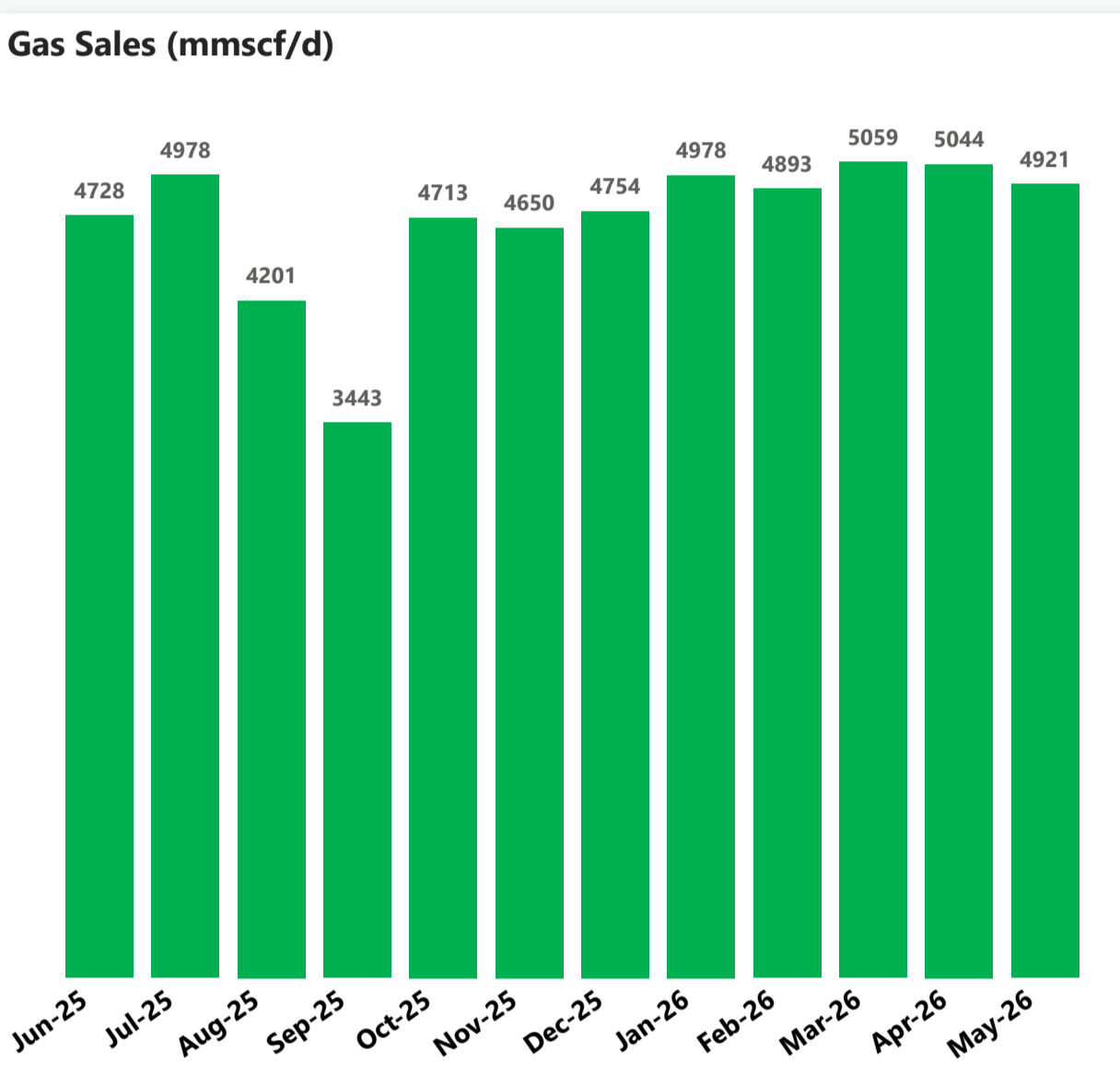

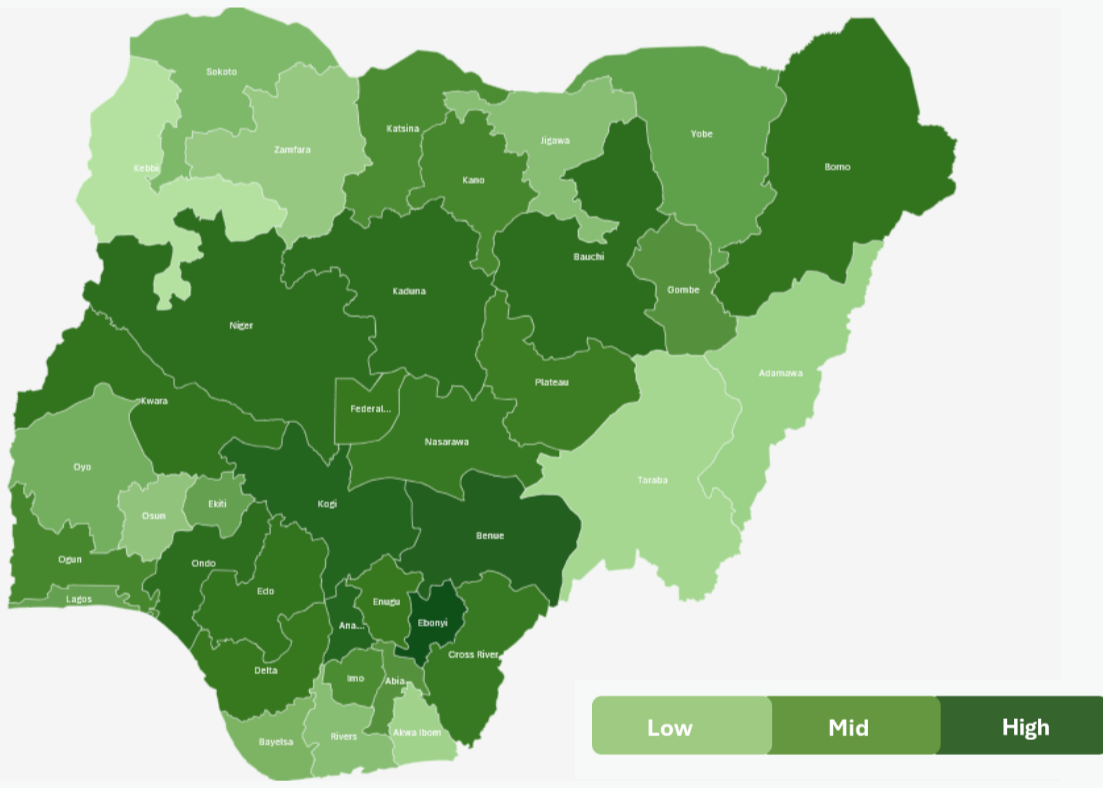

Strategic Efforts

Addressing well performance issues, reservoir pressure decline, lifting constraints, maintenance-related shutdowns, and facility reliability challenges will reduce production deferrals, improve asset availability and increase production.

Ajaokuta-Kaduna-Kano (AKK) Gas Pipeline:
AKK (Mainline): Advanced mainline construction, installation, and pre-commissioning activities to ensure early gas delivery to Abuja in 2026.

Obiafu-Obrikom-Oben (OB3) Gas Pipeline:
OB3 River Niger Crossing: Significantly progressed post pullback pre-commissioning and tie-in works required to achieve commissioning of the full OB3 pipeline section by end Q3 2026.

NNPC Foundation Public Impact Initiatives

Provision of MRI Machine at NAUTH, Nnewi

On 15 May 2026, the NNPC Foundation commissioned and handed over a state-of-the-art 1.5 Tesla MRI System, complete with chillers, UPS system, Battery Racks and backup power supply, to Nnamdi Azikiwe University Teaching Hospital (NAUTH), Nnewi, Anambra State.

Prior to the commissioning, 40 patients received free MRI scans during an organised training by GE for the radiologists and radiographers. This intervention is already improving access to advanced diagnostic services across the South-East, reducing the need for patient referrals, enabling early disease detection, and supporting specialist care delivery.

This initiative further demonstrates NNPC Limited's strong commitment to improving healthcare and driving national development
