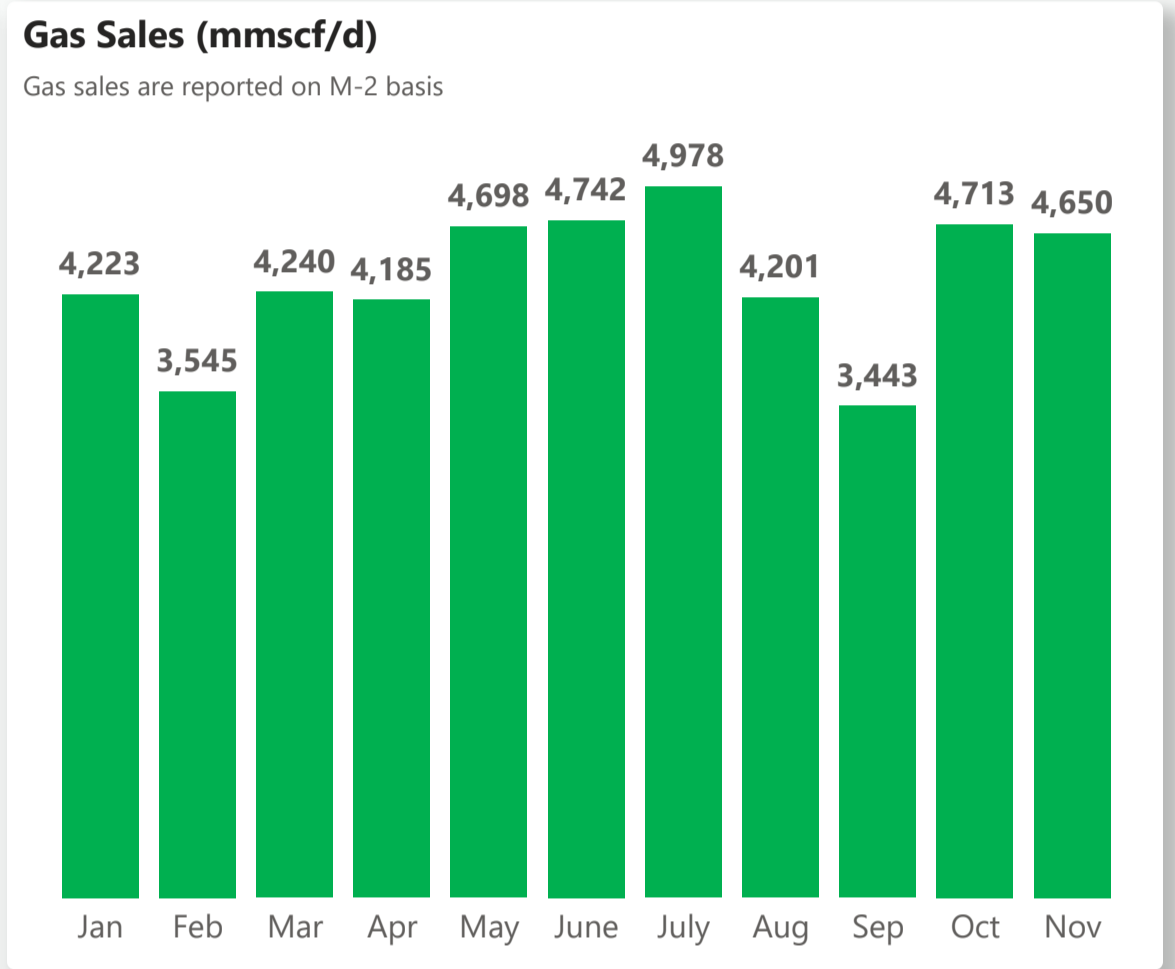

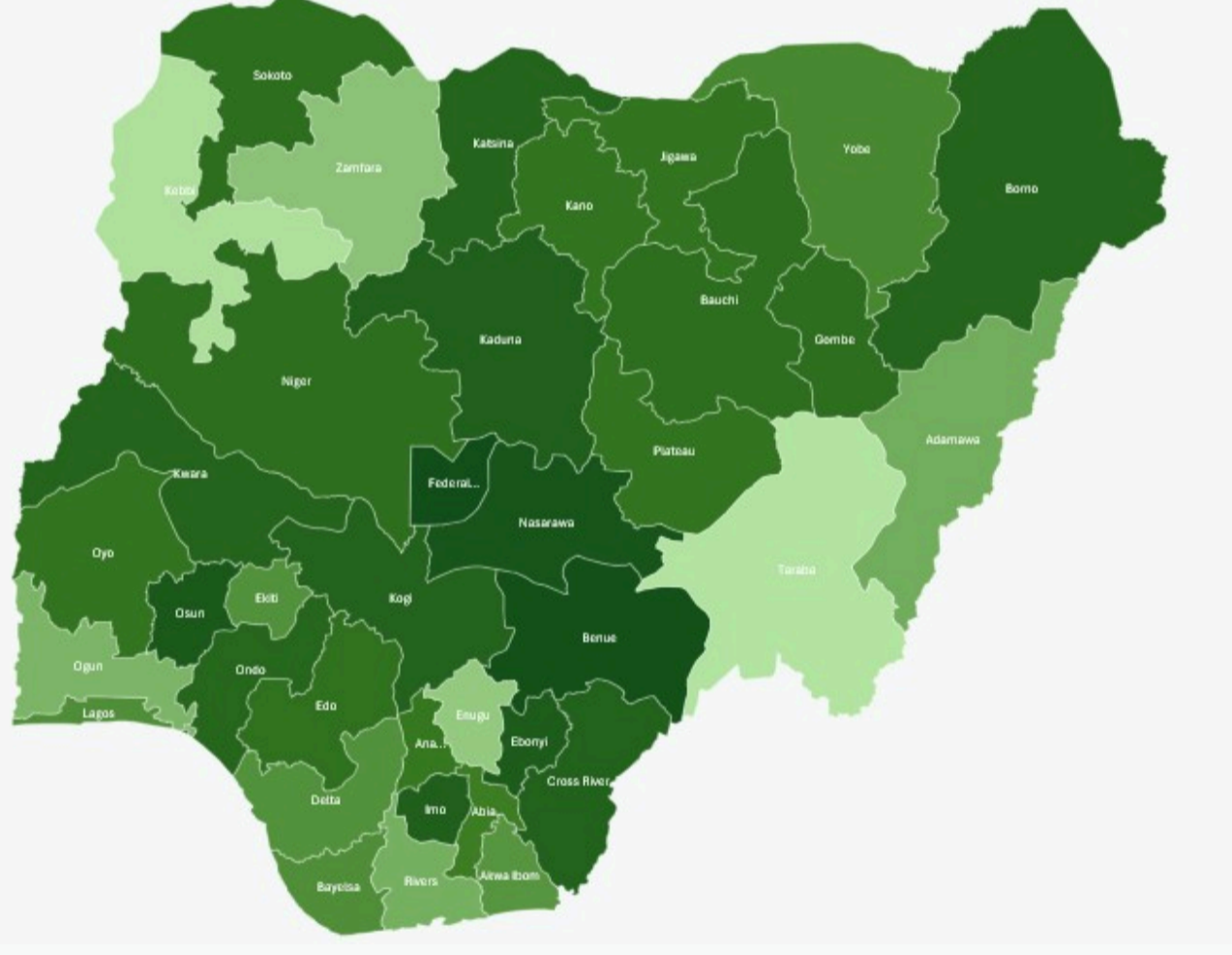

Strategic Efforts

Industry Collaboration:
November production performance was largely due to planned maintenance activities across key assets (Esso-Erha, Stardeep-Agbami, and Renaissance-Estuary Area) nearing completion, with production recovery expected at the end of December 2025 and continued delays with WAEP first oil.

Complete the 2025 scheduled facilities turn around maintenance (TAM), and production initiatives from JV, PSC, and NEPL assets in readiness for delivering the 2026 production plan.

Intensify collaboration with our partners through year-end and into 2026 to ensure improved production performance, maximise infrastructure uptime, and maintain high facility maintenance standards across all our assets.

Ajaokuta-Kaduna-Kano (AKK) Gas Pipeline:
AKK (Mainline): Significant progress recorded with completion of the mainline welding works and pressure-testing. Project is on course to be completed in 2026.

Obiafu-Obrikom-Oben (OB3) Gas Pipeline:
OB3 River Niger Crossing: All required equipment, materials and personnel mobilized to site; geotechnical data acquisition completed and early construction works ongoing in preparation for commencement of drilling.
